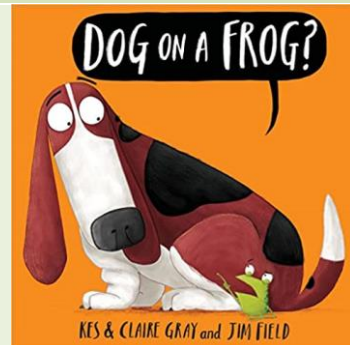
A Hippy Hoppy Toad

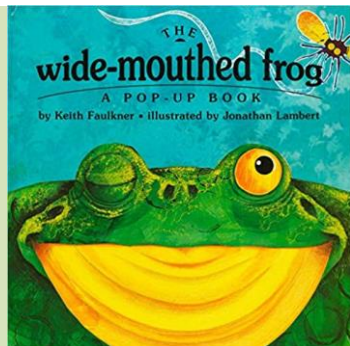
A Dog on a Frog

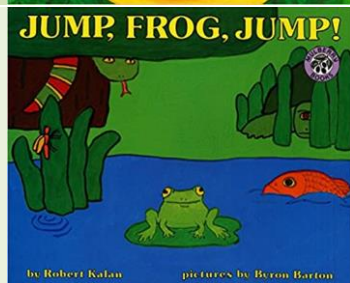
The Wide-

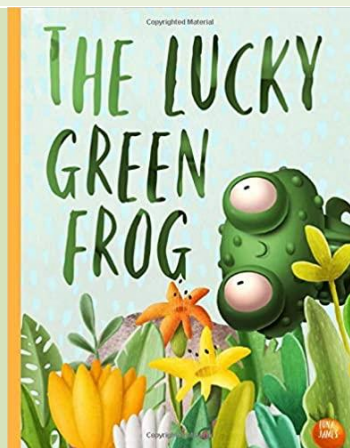
Jump frog Jum
